Calling all inspired young filmmakers!

As a group, do you have a story for a live-action film to tell that could inspire others? If so, enter our **Time to Inspire Storyboard Competition**, brought to you in partnership with Swatch.

Your filmmaking group could win the chance to see your idea made into a short film that will be screened at the Into Film Festival 2024 and shared across Into Film and Swatch platforms.

Young people have the power to change the world as our next generation of thinkers, doers and filmmakers. We want to bring your passions to life and share your story of inspiration.

Are you inspired to help others? Do you have an idea of how you would do it? Use the **Time to Inspire Storyboard sheet**, **About Our Film sheet** and **Entrants' Details sheet** to plan how you can break boundaries and stereotypes, show challenges you have overcome, or highlight what, who or where inspires you.

We will be looking for:

- ★ creativity
- ★ a clearly communicated idea
- ★ a storyboard that captures the theme and how it will translate onto the screen.

We're looking for live-action films only, so no animations please.

The theme: **TIME TO INSPIRE**

Please note that if you're shortlisted, your group will need to attend an in-person workshop in London on Saturday 18th May (reasonable expenses covered), and if you win, take part in about 20 hours of filmmaking workshops in June (we'll work around your availability and cover reasonable expenses).



How to enter:

The deadline for emailed entries is Sunday 21 April 2024 (23:59) and postal entries is Thursday 18 April 2024 (23:59).

- You can post your entry to Time to Inspire Storyboard Competition, FREEPOST RTAE-BAZG-CSZZ, Into Film, 31 Islington Green, London N1 8DU. Postal entries must be received by **Thursday 18 April 2024 (23:59)**.
- Or you can email a photograph or scanned copy of your entry to **entries@intofilm.org** with the subject line 'Time to Inspire Storyboard Competition'. Emailed entries must be received by **Sunday 21 April 2024 (23:59)**.
- **All entries must be submitted by an authorised adult (18+)** and must also include the authorised adult's name, email address and their permission for all young people to enter.
- The entry must also include the group's name, where the group is from and each young person's first name, age and school/organisation name, where applicable. Any entry that does not follow guidelines will be void. Terms and conditions apply.

Please email the Time to Inspire Storyboard Competition team at **entries@intofilm.org**, and we'll be happy to help.

Criteria for entry:

Use the **About Our Film sheet**, **Entrants' Details sheet** and **Time to Inspire Storyboard sheet** to tell us about the film you'd like to make. **Your entry must include all three of these** and meet the criteria listed to be considered.

It must be suitable for all audiences (for more guidance on what makes a film suitable for all ages, [check out this link on the BBFC website for what constitutes a U certificate](#)).

The storyboard should be detailed for a film no longer than 2 minutes and 30 seconds.

The storyboard should respond to the theme 'Time to Inspire'.

Your film must be live action (i.e. not animation).

This project is about working as a team, so you need to enter as a group of young people – minimum 5 and maximum 10 in a group. You can enter via your school, an organisation you belong to (e.g. a youth club) or independently.

Your group members must be between 13–19 years old.

You must have your group name on all sheets.

You must submit the About Our Film, Entrants' Details and Storyboard sheets. If you can't print the sheets, then you're welcome to recreate them in a typed or handwritten format. If you find it difficult to fill out the About Our Film sheet, you could always dictate what you want to say to someone else who can transcribe it onto the sheet for you.

Your entry must be drawn, not filmed or use photographs.

Individual young people can be part of more than one group entry if they want.
