They will learn that Jesus is God incarnate, one person in two natures; divine and human and make connections between the incarnation and the Trinity. Students will make connection between these beliefs about the impact of this on prayer.	Students will come to understand the sacraments as the extension of the incarnation through time, This unit focuses especially on the Mass, looking at the Passover event, the Last Supper and the celebration of the Mass today.	Students will understand the completion of the revelation through the giving of the Holy Spirit to the Church. This unit looks at the role the Holy Spirit plays in the life of the Church and in the lives of individuals. It also involves the study of mission and the Sacrament of Confirmation.	Students will explore the role of councils within the Church and how they make authoritative statements that clarify matters of faith and morals. In this unit students will also study the main beliefs and practices of Hinduism.
