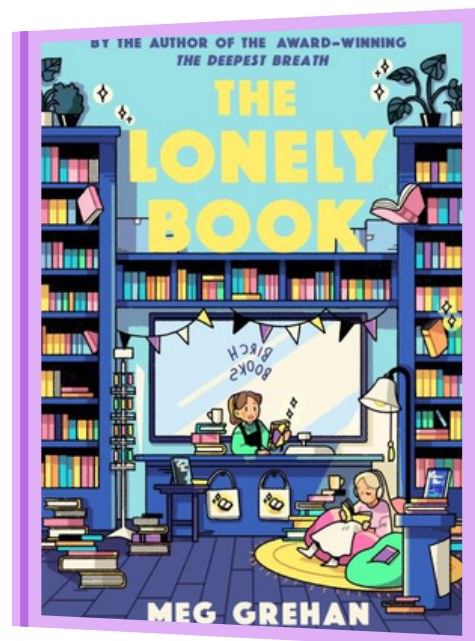
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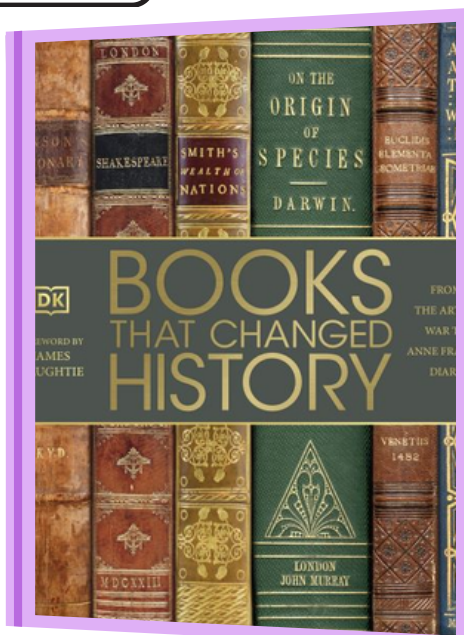
The bookshop is unhappy, and the moms are worried that the shop isn't making enough money
