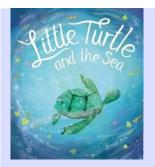

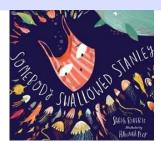
Clean up! Written by Nathan Byron and illustrated by Dapo Adeola

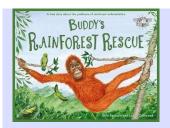
The Coral Kingdom Written by Sarah Roberts and illustrated by Hannah Peck

Deep, deep, deep under the sea ... lives Blobfish! Blobfish loves telling jokes, although he has no one to share them with, so he sets off on an adventure to find a friend. But sometimes friends turn up in the most unexpected places, even at the bottom of the ocean. This heartfelt and humorous story gently introduces children to themes of friendship, belonging and the issue of plastics in our oceans.



Buddy's Rainforest Rescue: A True Story About Deforestation Written by Ellie Jackson and illustrated by Laura Callwood

Buddy the Orangutan lives happily in the tangle of tall trees when he suddenly encounters the diggers destroying his magnificent rainforest home. Brave Buddy gets more than he bargained for and needs help from his rescuers to ensure a happy ending. Buddy's Rainforest Rescue is based on true events and it is this powerful message which invites children and adults alike to question the impact of palm oil and deforestation on our environment.



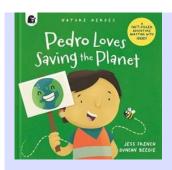

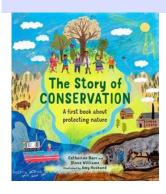
What A Waste: Rubbish, Recycling, and Protecting our Planet Written by Jess French

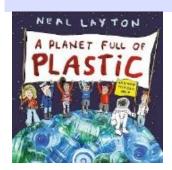
Greta and the Giants: inspired by Greta Thunberg's stand to save the world Written by Zoë Tucker and illustrated by Zoe Persico

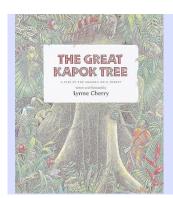


crisis – using allegory to make this important topic accessible to young children.

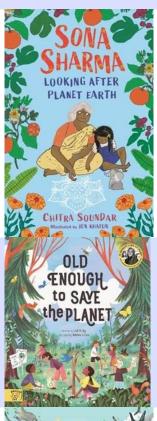






Scientists are Saving the World! Written by Saskia Gwinn and illustrated by Ana Albero

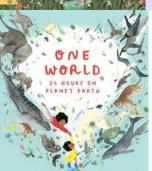


Sona Sharma: Looking after Planet Earth Written by Chitra Soundar and illustrated by Jen Khatun

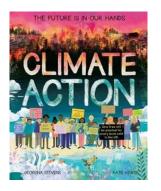


One Home Written by Hiba Noor Khan and illustrated by Rachael Dean

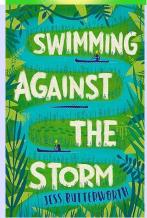

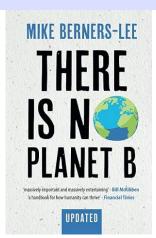
This Book Will Save The Planet Written by Dany Sigwalt and illustrated by Aurelia Durand

The main concern of young people is climate change and how to combat it. This book, the only official handbook from Extinction Rebellion Youth, will help you to change your life and change the world for the better.

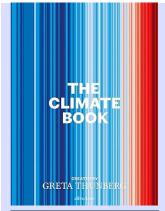


There Is No Planet B Written by Mike Berners-Lee

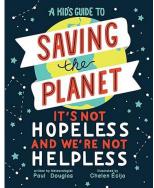








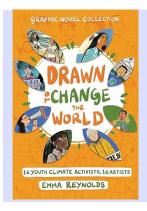
