WHAT POETIC FORM WILL YOU USE?

Acrostic

an acrostic is a poem in which the first letters of each line spell out a word or phrase

Free Verse

poems can be about any topic and can be of any length

🖈 Lyric

a short and personal poem

🖈 Rhyme

close similarity in the final sounds of two or more words or lines of writing

Anthem

represents the ideals of a group of people

WHAT POETIC TECHNIQUES WILL YOU INCLUDE?

Alliteration

a series of words begin with the same consonant sound

🖈 Simile

compares two different things using the words "like" or "as"

🖈 Metaphor

describes an object or action in a way that isn't literally true, but helps explain an idea or make a comparison

🖈 Onomatopoeia

where words evoke the actual sound of the thing they refer to or describe

Repetition


using the same word or phrase over and over again
