As school leaders we aim to lead by example. We have already put plans in place to strengthen our provision further to ensure every St John Bosco student leaves with the necessary skills to excel academically, spiritually, morally and socially.

The areas outlined below are part of our College Development Plan and we will monitor them carefully to ensure that progress is made to improve quality for our students.

"In a small number of subjects, including in the 6th form, leaders have not fully identified all the key knowledge that the pupils need to learn. This weakness limits the teachers' ability to implement the planned curriculum. As a result pupils don't achieve as well as they should in these subjects. Leaders should ensure that all curriculum plans set out the essential knowledge that staff will teach pupils."

Our staff are working very hard to ensure that there is a consistent experience across all subjects in our school.

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- "Some younger pupils have gaps in their reading ability. This means these pupils do not learn as well as they should in a range of subjects. Leaders should fully implement their new reading strategy and ensure that pupils catch up quickly in their reading."
 - School staff continue to work hard to ensure that any gaps in reading ability are being addressed across the curriculum and through dedicated interventions.

Our success is a team effort- the staff, students, parents and the wider community all underpin our school mission statement "...we seek to nurture the gifts, dreams and talents of all in the spirit of St John Bosco" and helps us to promote a vibrant, supportive and friendly atmosphere.
