## Reminder of school processes

### Attendance During Exam Season

Please be reminded that we **cannot authorise study leave**; all pupils are expected to remain in school until the conclusion of the exam series. Should your child have an appointment, please provide a note detailing the appointment time and whether they will be collected or will make their own way to the appointment/home.

### Students are still calling home during school day

Students should **not** contact parents from personal mobiles during the school day.

If a student has a concern or feels unwell during the school day, we have a designated process in place - which all students are made aware of:

1. **Consulting the class teacher or PPC:** Students should, in the first instance, speak to the class teacher or their PPC.
2. **PPC Decision:** The PPC will make a judgment call to decide whether the student should be sent home or encouraged to continue in school and continue to assess their wellbeing.
3. **Communication:** If the decision is made to send a student home, the PPC or a member of the office team will call home using contact details on record provided by parent/carer. It is therefore vital to keep contact details up to date with the school.

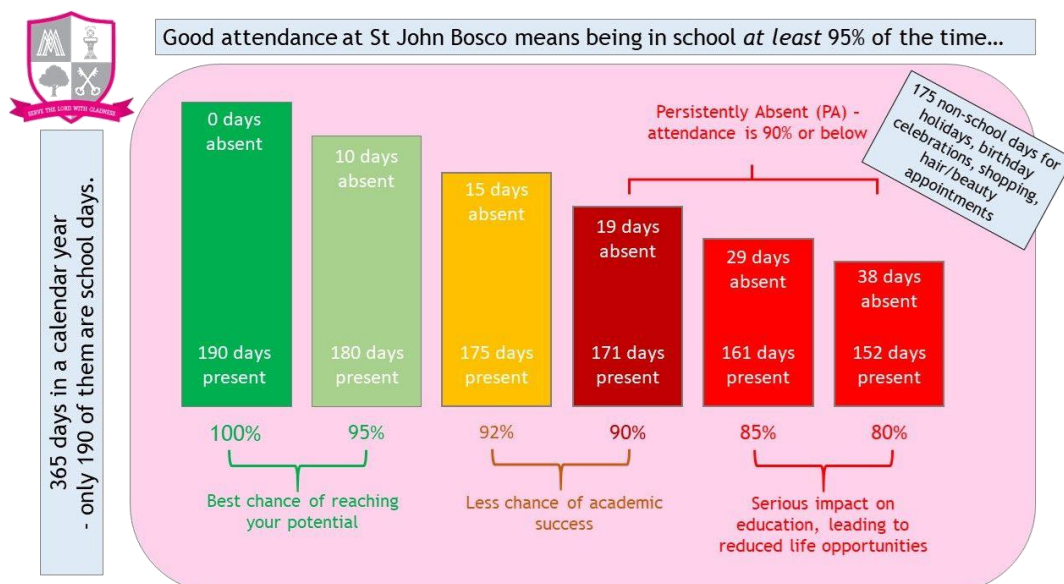
*“Mobile Phones: The College will continue with the policy of permitting students to have a mobile phone in College but it must be switched off and placed in the students’ locker between 8.25am and 2.55pm. Failure to follow this rule will lead to the phone being confiscated and a detention issued.”*

### Punctuality & Attendance

Pupils are expected to arrive at school by 8.25am; morning registers are taken by 8.35am. Arriving to form after the register has been called will result in a late mark.

The pupil is then required to attend a 20-minute lunch detention on that same day. If a pupil does not attend the 20-minute lunch detention they will attend 30-minute after school that day.

Pupils arriving after 8.55am will receive an hour detention after school on the same day.
