




How does attendance affect my GCSE results?

- One paper is non calculator and the other 2 papers are Calculator allowed



Specification: Combined Science (Trilogy)

- The assessment consists of six, 75 minute papers each 70 marks (2 Biology, 2 Chemistry, 2 Physics)
- Paper 1 for each subject is the Year 10 content and Paper 2 is the Year 11 content
- Each paper is equally weighted, and the total score is used to allocate a *double* grade
