<p>How have you/your school previously supported another school?</p>	<p>I have supported several secondary schools in the NW as an SLE and as part of teaching school work at Bishop Rawstorne Teaching School over several years. I have also recently supported the science department of a school in St Helens as part of work with the Archdiocese.</p>
<p>What was the specific impact of your support?</p>	<p>My SLE evaluations were extremely positive and I was on deployment 3 days a week. In two supported schools I was seconded onto the leadership team during transition after an inadequate Ofsted judgement. I interviewed, trained and supported a large team of SLEs recruited from 18 schools as part of the alliance, and was responsible for the protocols and evaluations for all the school-to-school projects. I presented this to the System Leadership Conference in 2016.</p> <p>In my final year at Bishops, the three schools that received a package of support from the TSA for their science departments all subsequently went from inadequate to good in their next inspection.</p>
