Daily Routine

Before college: Pupils should wait in the ground floor communal areas. When the first bell rings at 8.25 am, pupils should deposit their coats and bags in their locker and go to their form room.

Break/Lunch: At the beginning of break and lunch, all pupils must return to their lockers to deposit their books. <u>All</u> food must be eaten in the Dining Hall or on The Hill at the tables provided, or outside (weather permitting).

Pupils may go out to the playground and gardens. Respect for the environment, buildings and equipment will ensure that this privilege continues.

Food and Drink: All food, including packed lunches, must be consumed in the designated areas. There must be no eating, drinking or chewing in classrooms or on corridors.

Litter: All pupils should avoid leaving litter and should make a conscious effort to keep the College buildings and grounds tidy. We are all responsible for litter at the college.

Before lessons: Stand behind chairs until greeted by the teacher, then sit quietly.

At the end of lessons: At the end of each lesson pupils should stand quietly when instructed to do so by the member of staff. They should go to the next lesson in a quiet and orderly manner.

College Rules

Movement about the building

When moving about the building, pupils should **walk in single file** to the right of the corridors and stairs, **quietly**, so as not to disturb other pupils who are in lessons.

Uniform

Correct uniform must be worn at all times. All possessions and items of uniform should be clearly and permanently marked: it is the responsibility of each pupil to look after her own belongings.

Jewellery, make-up, nail varnish, dyed hair or extensions are not allowed as they are out of place with College uniform. In the interests of hygiene, long hair must be tied back. Ribbons or bobbles must be plain black, pink or grey. Hair styles must be in keeping with College uniform. If hair is plaited it must not have any type of adornment.

Pupils with pierced ears may wear one pair of small plain <u>stud</u> earrings in the lobes of the ears. Piercing of any other part of the body is **not** acceptable.

<u>WARNING</u>: If jewellery is worn in College it may be temporarily confiscated. The items will be locked away securely by the Pupil Progress Coordinator, but the College **CANNOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE LOSS OR THEFT OF ANY ITEM.**

Money

We are a cashless school. There won't be a requirement for children to have large sums of money in school as ALL school payments are taken via ParentPay including lunches and trips.

Buses

Orderly behaviour is expected at all times on buses and in queues. The College is judged by pupils' conduct and appearance in the community.

Lockers

Each pupil will be provided with a secure locker in which to store books, equipment, bags and personal belongings. Pupils may not carry bags around the College and, therefore, will organise their equipment for the next session at break and lunch. A charge of £5 will be made for the replacement of lost keys.

Items strictly forbidden

No pupil may have in College – cigarettes, vapes, matches, chewing gum, CD players, iPods, comics, magazines, glass bottles or liquid paper or any other item that may be considered dangerous within the school setting.

Essential Equipment

Each pupil must ensure that they bring to College each day the following basic equipment: pen, pencils, ruler, eraser and student planner. A suitable bag is required for homework books. Text books and stationery are expensive and must be looked after carefully. Polythene bags are inadequate for this purpose, but may be used for their PE kit.

Pupils must carry their student planners with them at all times during lessons and when sent for by a member of staff.

College Fund

Each pupil is expected to contribute to the College Fund by taking part in appropriate fund-raising activities.

Student Attendance and Punctuality Policy

The attendance target for every student at St John Bosco is 100% and not below 97%

St John Bosco Arts College expects all students to have an attendance of 97% or above. This is because excellent attendance allows you to reach your full potential.

Excellent attendance is not only important for you to maximise your potential but it is also important for building friendships and relationships in school. Positive friendships and relationships contribute to how happy you feel when you are at school.

All children of school age must attend school **by law.** Your parents/carers have a legal responsibility to ensure you attend school regularly. Poor attendance affects your performance in exams and will affect your grades and your chances once you leave school.

Absence from school

If for any reason you are going to be absent from school due to illness, your parent/carer must contact the school on the morning of your absence explaining the reason for absence and how long they expect you to be off school.

Acceptable Reasons for absence: Illness, **emergency** dental/medical appointments and a family bereavement.

When you return to school following an absence, your parent/carer must supply a note for your form tutor/PPC which explains the reason for absence. In some cases, if a student has low attendance, the school may ask for medical evidence; for example, an appointment card or prescription.

Medical evidence must be shown to your PPC and the attendance office who will take a copy and store in your folder. The school will never ask for a sick note from a doctor unless you are going to be absent for a long time.

Medical and Dental Appointments

Medical and dental appointments should be made outside of school hours. Where this is not possible, students should bring a copy of the appointment card or letter to show to their PPC. We expect students to attend school following their medical or dental appointment.

Holidays

Holidays during term time are not allowed and your parent/carer may be fined if you take a holiday during term time. More than one holiday in a school term could lead to court action.

Punctuality

It is extremely important that you arrive to school by 8.25am. Registers are taken at 8.35am and if you arrive after this time, you will receive a late mark and must attend a lunchtime detention. If you arrive after 8.55am, you will need to attend an after-school detention. When lateness to school becomes a problem, parents/carers will be referred to Ms Crellin, the Education Welfare Officer.

The Attendance Team

All students whose attendance falls below 95% are referred to the School Attendance Officers. If a student's attendance continues to get worse, the parent/carer will be invited in for a meeting. Any student with an attendance of 90% or below is classed by the government as 'Persistently Absent.' If a student's attendance falls to 92% or below, this is when our Education Welfare Officer becomes involved and works with the families to improve attendance but in cases where there isn't an improvement, parents face legal action such as a fine or court action.

If you are experiencing any problems that are affecting your attendance to school or you feel might do in the future, then speak to your PPC or our attendance officers.

Footwear

It is essential that all pupils entering Science Laboratories or Technology Workshops wear shoes, NOT sandals. Therefore, sandals are not permitted in College. Platform shoes with soles higher than one inch are not allowed and the shoes must be flat. Shoes must also be fully enclosed. Trainers or boots are not acceptable as a school shoe.

Mobile Phones

The College will continue with the policy of permitting students to have a mobile phone in College but it must be switched off and placed in the students' locker between 8.25am and 2.50pm. Failure to follow this rule will lead to the phone being confiscated and parents will collect it at 2.50pm the next school day. Use of mobile phones to take photographs or videos whilst in the school building is strictly forbidden.

Rewards and Sanctions

Rewards

The college aims to promote high standards of behaviour, self-discipline and learning through positive encouragement and reward.

You will be expected to keep the following classroom rules in all lessons:

- arrive to lessons on time
- follow directions first time
- arrive with all the correct equipment
- listen when someone else is speaking
- put your hand up to speak.

ClassCharts will be used to award achievement points and also negative behaviour points. Pupils and Parents/Carers will be supplied with a ClassCharts login, to be able to monitor this activity.

Sanctions

If you fail to keep the classroom rules you will receive a negative behaviour point on ClassCharts for that lesson. If you choose not to meet the required high standards of behaviour then you must expect to meet the consequences.

You may be given a detention during break, lunch or for up to an hour after school without any notice.

- You might be placed on report. Your report card will be checked by your Form Tutor or Progress Coordinator and sent home for your parents to sign each day, your parents will be required to attend a meeting at the college to discuss any issues.
- In serious cases you may be excluded from school, be placed in the inclusion room or have to appear before a Governors' Disciplinary Committee.
- Persistent acts of serious indiscipline will result in permanent exclusion from the college.

With the exception of the school blazer and PE kit, all other items including: white blouses, plain grey skirts, trousers, pinafores or jumpers may be purchased from supermarkets or other retailers.

In the interest of security, all uniform items must be clearly marked with the owner's name.

Students joining the college in other year groups will not be eligible to a free school uniform but a supply of clean, good quality pre-loved items are available to all. Parents/carers are asked to consider donating and collecting pre-loved items; as well as the financial benefits, this reduces clothing waste and helps the environment.

Information on PE Kit

Pupils are required to bring their PE kit on every occasion that the subject appears on their timetable so that they are equipped to participate to their maximum potential in each lesson.

Failure to bring PE kit policy

- 1. If a pupil forgets part of or all of their PE kit for the **first time**, this is logged on ClassCharts they and must borrow kit from the PE department stock, please note all kit in the department is washed and dried.
- 2. If a pupil forgets their kit for the **second time**, they will receive a detention from their class teacher. A detention will be issued for every two occasions of incorrect kit, repeated issues may result in a Subject Report being issued.
- 3. Persistent lack of organisation with PE kits will be referred to the Head of Department, Mrs Ward, and the pupils PPC for further discussion and contact with parents/carers.

N.B Refusal to wear PE department kit is deemed as defiance to school rules and as such students will receive an immediate detention and added on ClassCharts.

September 2025 Free Uniform

Your child will receive a FREE school uniform.

Parents/carers will be given vouchers for our stockists to purchase uniform items. This will cover the below listed items to a particular amount. If pupils would prefer a more expensive item (for example a pinafore instead of skirt, parents/carers would need to 'make up the extra'). Although we use a range of stockists, supermarket alternatives for plain items of uniform are permissible.

St John Bosco Arts College is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school we have ensured that members of our staff, Clare Roberts (Designated Safeguarding Lead) and Sophie Forster (Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead) and are known as the Key Adults, have been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
